Time: 12.10 pm to 1.40 pm

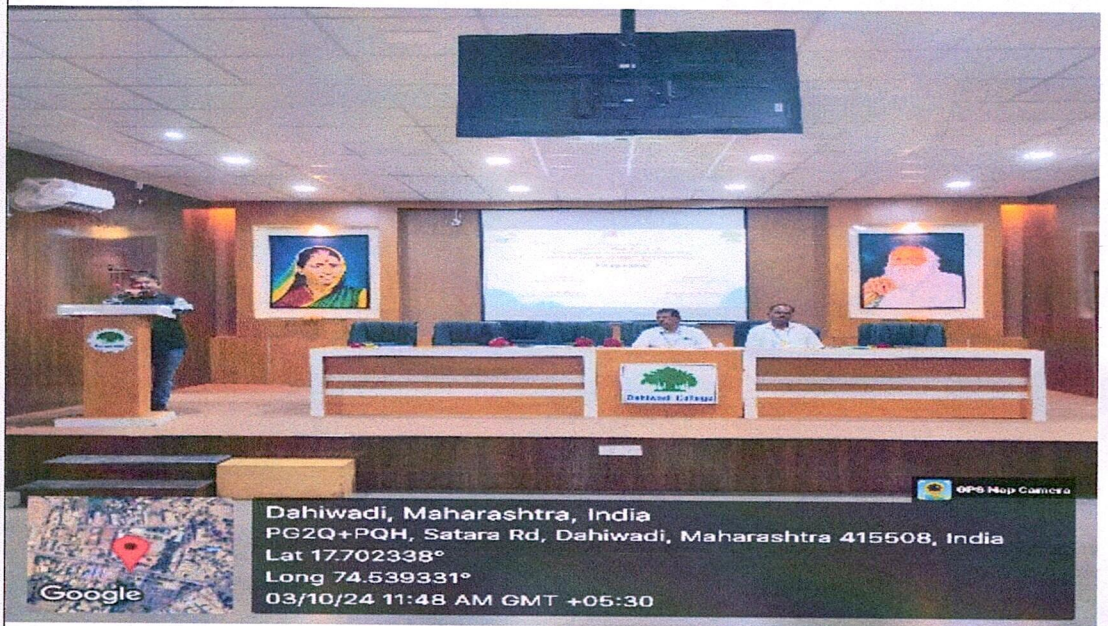
Resource person: Dr. Shivkumar Agrawal

Resource person: Dr. Abhijeet Mulik

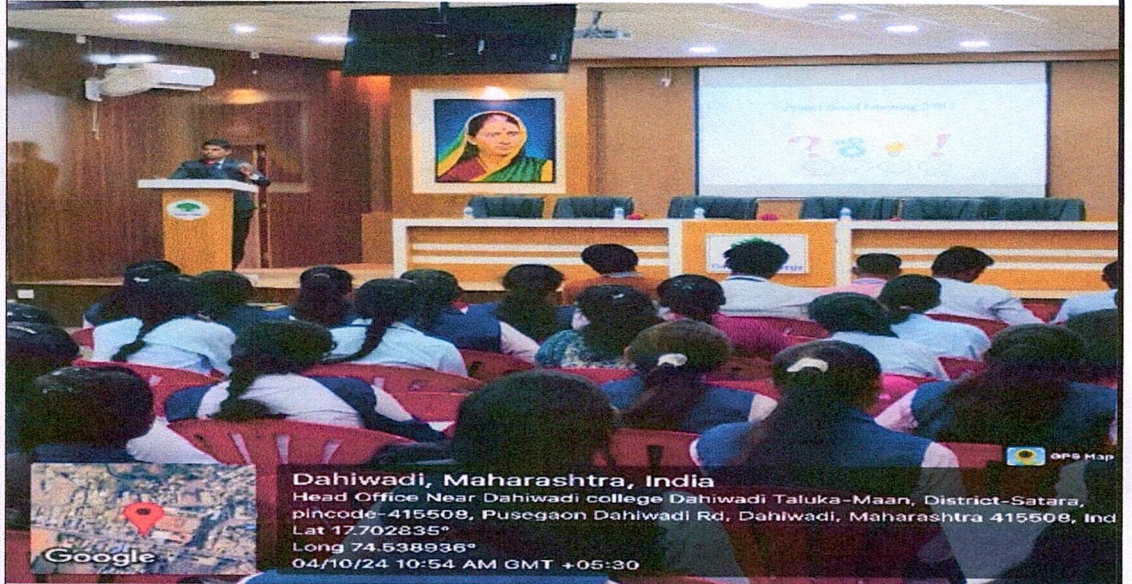

Session 3: Valedictory Ceremony

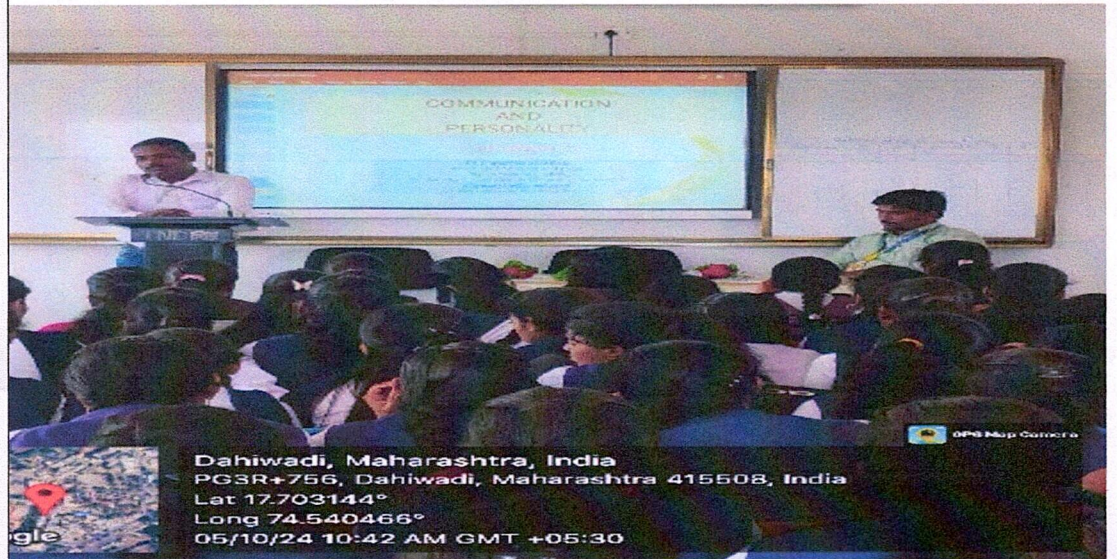
Time: 1.40 pm to 2.10 pm

Conclusion:

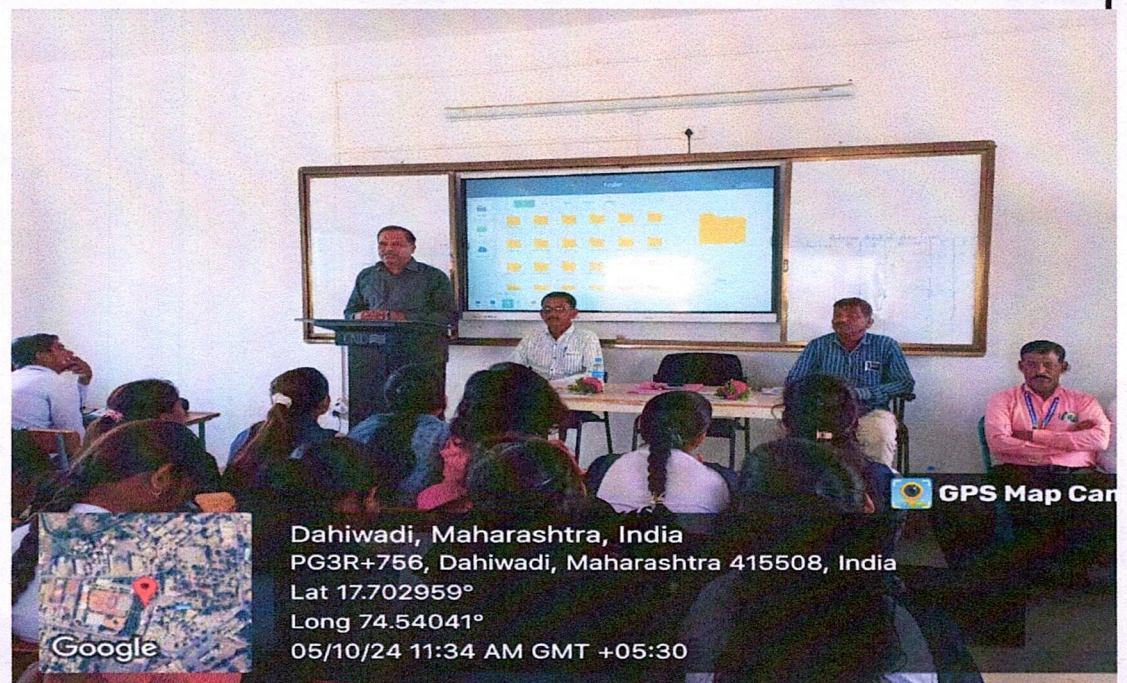









